### 5. SPEEDING ISSUES

Further to the speeding concerns raised at recent meetings, Andy Pratt (Deputy Police Crime Commissioner) will meet City Cllr Stephen Thompson at Inglewhite crossroads at **10.30 on Weds 26<sup>th</sup> July** to discuss the local concerns.

**Members and residents are invited to attend to discuss any highway related concerns with him.**

In addition to the above, Members are requested to **note** that further to

- **MIN 16a** LCC have been asked to provide an update on the refresh of the rubble strips and road markings at Button Street.
- **MIN 16b** a map showing the current speed limits and the location of the speed roundels has been requested.
- **MIN 16c** the Police have been invited to attend the meeting to discuss speed enforcement and the use of the mobile speed gun.
- **MIN 17** Waddecar Scout Camp have replied that their direction information already recommends that visitors go through Inglewhite and Button Lane however, they will try to emphasize this more. LCC are yet to reply to the request for 'do not follow sat nav' signs.

**MIN 16d** Grimsargh Parish Council have provided details of a contact at another Parish Council, who will erect a Speed Indicator Device (SPID) on an existing SPID plate and will record the speed data for 8-10 days at a cost of £150 per location plus mileage.

The data can be presented to the Parish Council who can use it to evidence a speeding problem or inform a decision on whether to buy a SPID or not.

**Members are requested to consider if this is an approach they wish to trial - noting that the device can only be erected on an existing SPID plate.**

Unfortunately, LCC do not have records of where the plates are located. If new SPID plates or poles are required, the location will need to be assessed by LCC and a S50 licence will be required. SPIDS can be attached to lighting columns but these are subject to structural tests.

### 6. NEW CORRESPONDENCE

Members are requested to **note** there will be a temporary closure of Rigg Lane, Beacon Fell, Goosnargh from 25/09/23 to 26/09/23 to enable Morrison Telecom to install a new telegraph pole.

## 7. PRESTON CITY COUNCIL DOG CONTROL ORDERS AND LITTER BINS

Preston City Council have 4 Dog Control Public Space Protection Orders which are due to expire in October 2023. The City Council are looking to extend the Orders for another 3 years. The Orders provide the legislative powers for the following to be regarded as offences

- Fouling of Land by Dogs Order 2012 – makes it an offence for a person in charge of a dog which defecates on any land covered by this order and fails to pick it up.
- Dogs Exclusion Order 2012 – makes it an offence for dogs to be exercised in certain areas of the City – e.g the Cemetery, play areas etc
- Dogs on Leads by Direction Order 2012 – makes it an offence for a person to fail to put his/her dog on a lead, when asked to do so by an authorised officer.
- Dogs on Leads Order 2012 – makes it an offence not to have a dog on a lead when exercising it in certain areas of the city.

**Members are requested to consider supporting the Orders for another 3 years.**
